To take a course, contact your local Coordinator directly; they'll have a list of available dates. In Canada, Glen Purcell from Vancouver, BC, serves as the National ATLS Coordinator (glen.purcell@vch.ca). The ATLS app is also available, offering updated content and features. Hard copies of the 9th edition Student Manual can be shipped upon request; participants in an ATLS course receive a copy. If you don't take a course, manuals can still be purchased. For more information on courses, contact your regional Coordinator or visit myatls.com. To obtain a new student card, contact your Regional Program Coordinator. For an ATLS faculty status to remain current, teach in at least four courses within a four-year cycle. If lost or damaged, contact your Regional Program Coordinator again. After moving, reach out to the same coordinator for program involvement steps. The ATLS program office can be contacted through their staff list and geographic area management. TAC manages no ATLS courses; however, their website offers Canadian regional contacts for those interested in taking ATLS courses within Canada.
