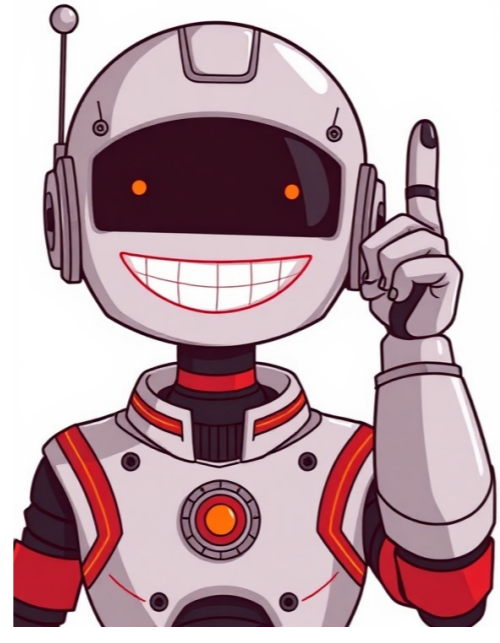

Looking forward to exploring the many fascinating things that Singapore has to offer, especially when it comes to enjoying a fun-filled day out without breaking the bank is a must for many of us. Although, Singapore was recently named the most expensive city worldwide for the ninth time in eleven years, many cool activities are still available for free. We went on a mission to discover 30 of the best free things to do in Singapore and found some fantastic options, so you can have fun without spending too much money. Definitely, one of the best free rainy day activities in Singapore is National Gallery's Keppel Centre for Art Education. This place offers many free activities for families with children to engage in a world of art together. You can definitely try their workshops, interactive learning zones, immersive games, and much more. Another great option is the Mandai Boardwalk, which is a scenic 3.3km trail to explore for free in Singapore. The wheelchair-friendly boardwalk skirts the perimeter of River Wonders and Singapore Zoo, offering stunning views of the Upper Seletar Reservoir and the Central Catchment Nature Reserve. Visitors can enjoy glimpses of zoo animals and stop by five thematic stations inspired by local ecosystems. Gelam Gallery Singapore's first outdoor art gallery is hidden along Muscat Street and it's totally free to wander. The alleyways are decked out in colourful designs, vibrant wall murals, graffiti, and pop culture elements by popular multi-disciplinary artist PrettyFreakyFantasy among more than 30 other artists from places like Malaysia, France, China, and more. Singapore's revamped Chinese and Japanese Gardens at Jurong Lake Gardens is another place you can visit. The exotic nature park opened to the public recently after five years of reconstruction works. Today, the gardens feature new attractions such as a Bamboo Groove, edible plants, cascading waterfalls, an ig-worthy cenote water feature, and much more. The Changi Jurassic Mile is also a great place to meet larger-than-life dinosaurs at this outdoor display at Changi Airport. Discover more than 20 different creatures, from gigantic T-Rex to huge dinosaur eggs, there's plenty to see for free on the 1km path. Lastly, Upper Seletar Reservoir Park has a secret landmark named Seletar Rocket Tower. Visitors can climb up to the top of tower and be treated to gorgeous views of the green hills and water or even stargaze at night all for free. Definitely, one of the best things about these places is that they are not only fun but also educational. Many museums and galleries are free to enter for citizens and permanent residents. You can get educated on art at National Gallery Singapore, play with toys at MINT, see historical artefacts at National Museum Of Singapore, and plenty more. Wondering where to catch free concerts? There are many options available, from outdoor performances to classical music events. You can definitely check out the schedules and plan your visit accordingly.
