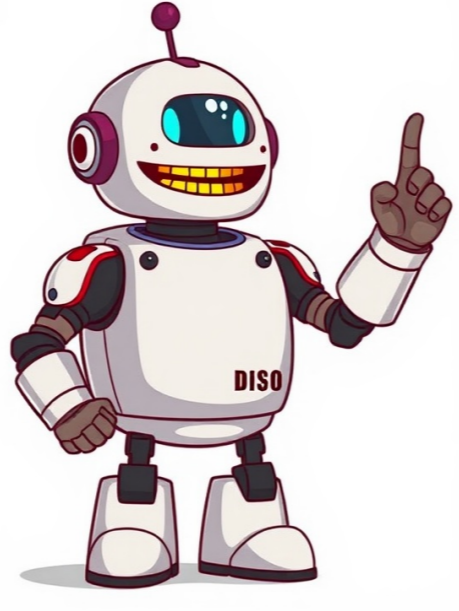

Emotive has the more restricted meaning of 'tending to arouse emotion', and is often associated with issues, subjects, language, and words.
