Painted in June 1889, it depicts the view from the eastern window of its kindergarten in Saint-Rémy-de-Provence, just before dawn, with the addition of an imaginary village. Expressionist paintings are characterized by distortions and exaggerations to create an emotional effect. What can be understood as impressionism or symbolism is the desire to convey sensations, ideas, effects - impressions rather than describing musical facts in an accurate way. Compositionally, this was done through research for new colors - in music that translates as unusual scales or non-orthodox rhythms for example - and a breakdown of the Convention - in particular In the structures. Overall, the impressionism seems very different from one artist to another. In other words, anyone who enjoys Debussy may not be passionate about satie, while they seem very different from each other. It is less the case With someone who loves Chopin or Liszt, Mozart or Haydn. Impressionism in music - just like his equivalent in painting - was enormously influential over everything he followed. Breaking from the Germanic and daring tradition not to follow his strict well-established rules present in so much classical music written over the centuries, Debussy broke all the rules of music. And so they made those who followed later, not only in France, but all over the world.
