Oasis gira 2025

Es oficial: Oasis ofrecerán hasta 14 conciertos en 2025 que tendrán lugar en ciudades como Cardiff, Manchester, Londres, Edimburgo y Dublín. Contra todo pronóstico y tras más de una década enfrentados y alimentando sus carreras paralelas, los miembros de Oasis, el grupo fundacional y generacional del britpop por antonomasia, así lo acaban de confirmar tras un teaser publicado ayer en sus redes sociales. Nadie daba un duro porque esto fuera cierto, y mucho menos desde que en los últimos años cualquier atisbo de reunión y reencuentro terminase en aguas de borraja y en meros fuegos fatuos. La última vez que de hecho los Gallagher jugaban con nuestra ilusión fue a mediados de 2024, cuando desde la cuenta oficial de la banda anunciaban la reedición de su disco debut, *Definitely Maybe* (1994), con motivo de su 30 aniversario. Ocasión que el bueno de Liam aprovechó para marcarse una particular gira en solitario por Reino Unido, interpretando en directo y de forma íntegra dicho álbum. Definitivamente, habíamos perdido la fe en que algún día volviéramos a ver a Noel y Liam enterrando el hacha de guerra y fumándose la pipa de la paz, especialmente con los continuos puyazos y recaditos que ambos hermanos acostumbraaban a dejarse mutuamente en entrevistas o en redes sociales (en los últimos años, de hecho, el perfil público del menor de los hermanos parecía una absoluta cuenta paródica dedicada únicamente a sollar exabruptos sobre el tema). Pero el éxito es de lo que tienen paciencia y los millones de seguidores con los que Oasis cuenta alrededor de todo el mundo han visto por fin recompensada su espera con una noticia que jamás creíamos que podríamos dar: Oasis han vuelto. Todo comenzó, como es habitual, con un misterioso anuncio en las redes sociales de los hermanos Gallagher que logró encender la ilusión entre los fans del popular grupo británico. Una simple fecha, 27/08/2024, enmarcada en el famoso logo de la formación, y un mensaje emplazándonos a las 8h de la mañana de ese día para desvelarnos una noticia. Huelga decir que tras dicha publicación la rumología saltó por los aires y de ahí a los principales medios británicos, los cuales daban por hecho la vuelta de la banda. Pues bien, ya no hace falta que prestemos atención a las elucubraciones sensacionalistas de determinados fuentes ni leamos más artículos de tabloides oportunistas sobre el tema. Tal y como la propia banda se ha encargado de hacer público a primerísima hora de la mañana de hoy, martes 27 de agosto, el regreso de Oasis es oficial y tendrá lugar en su Reino Unido natal con hasta catorce fechas que serán acogidas en diferentes puntos de la geografía británica a lo largo del verano de 2025. De momento ahí lo dejan, en casa y para los suyos (¡algo es algo!), pero quién sabe; si el experimento sale bien y los Gallagher no se tiran demasiado de los pelos sobre el escenario durante esta gira, tal vez lleguen a extender sus fechas más allá de las islas, ¿no?

Oasis El regreso de Oasis ya es una realidad. Los hermanos Gallagher han puesto fin a los conflictos que los llevaron a separarse en 2009 y, tras casi 15 años de espera, las canciones del mítico grupo de rock volverán a sonar en los grandes escenarios. Se confirma así el regreso de dos astros de la música como Liam y Noel Gallagher que han pasado gran parte de su vida enfrentados. La pareja de hermanos, que en los últimos años habían hecho carreras en solitario tras años de disputas, regresarán a una serie de conciertos en Reino Unido e Irlanda, aunque se espera que la cosa no quede ahí. «Las armas han callado. Las estrellas se han alineado. La gran espera ha terminado. Venid a verlo. No será televisado. Aquellos interesados en adquirir las entradas de la gira de Oasis para 2025 podrán hacerlo el próximo sábado 31 de agosto. Según han anunciado desde la banda, los tickets saldrán a la venta a las 09:00 hora local (10:00 hora peninsular) a través de las páginas web de ticketmaster.co.uk, gigsandtours.com y seetickets.com. Por su parte, aquellos que deseen hacerse con las entradas para los conciertos de Dublín podrán hacerlo ese mismo día a partir de las 8:00 hora local por medio de ticketmaster.ie. Oasis ha anunciado las fechas de la siguiente etapa de su gira mundial, con paradas, por el momento, en Canadá, Estados Unidos y México.La gira comienza el 24 de agosto con un concierto inaugural en el Rogers Stadium de Toronto, Canadá antes de que Liam y Noel Gallagher viajen a Estados Unidos para ofrecer tres conciertos. Estos se compondrán de una noche en el Soldier Field de Chicago y otra en el MetLife Stadium de Nueva Jersey, los días 28 y 31 de agosto respectivamente, seguidas de un concierto en el Rose Bowl Stadium de Los Angeles el 6 de septiembre. También se ha anunciado un concierto en Ciudad de México, que tendrá lugar en el Estadio GNP Seguros el 12 de septiembre. El conjunto confirmó que estos serían, al menos el año que viene, sus únicos shows en Europa, así como su ausencia de todos los festivales que se organicen. Sin embargo, se acerca otra hornada de fechas internacionales, eso sí, fuera del Viejo Continente.Una sorpresa inesperadaDurante el final de su concierto en el festival de Reading, Liam tocó el álbum debut de estudio de Oasis, ‘Definetely Maybe’ (1994), al completo. Como puede que sepas, el disco está a punto de reeditarse por su 30º aniversario. El una entrevista con el medio, el experto en industria musical Jonathan Shillt OBE, presidente de la agencia de talentos InterTalent, afirmó que “entre entradas, patrocinadores, merchandising y grabaciones”, Noel y Liam se llevarían unos 50 millones cada uno. Los hermanos Gallagher se reunieron semanas antes de anunciar la nueva gira de Oasis para una sesión de fotos secreta.Liam Gallagher y Noel Gallagher se preparan para una de las reuniones más esperadas en el mundo de la música. Los primeros conciertos en el Reino Unido se vieron afectados por largas filas virtuales y problemas técnicos en la compra de entradas, además de precios inflados debido a la “tarifa dinámica”. En respuesta, Oasis añadió dos fechas adicionales en el Wembley Stadium, vendiendo las entradas en lotes escalonados mediante un sistema de invitación. Además, la banda afirmó no haber tenido conocimiento previo de la implementación de la tarifa dinámica.Durante su paso por el continente americano, Oasis se presentará en Canadá, Estados Unidos, México, Brasil, Argentina y Chile (AP Foto)“Es importante aclarar que Oasis deja las decisiones sobre la venta de entradas y precios completamente en manos de sus promotores y gestión, y en ningún momento tuvo conocimiento de que se iba a utilizar la tarificación dinámica”, declararon en un comunicado.La Autoridad de Competencia y Mercados (CMA) del Reino Unido ha iniciado una investigación sobre esta práctica de precios, asegurando que “las personas fueron sometidas a presión para comprar entradas en un corto periodo de tiempo, a un precio más alto del que entendían que pagar, lo que podría afectar sus decisiones de compra”. Además, Lisa Nandy, Secretaria de Cultura del Reino Unido, expresó su descontento al afirmar que era “deprimente ver que los precios enormemente inflados excluyen a los fans de a pie de la posibilidad de disfrutar de su banda favorita en directo”. El regreso de Oasis ha reabierto el debate sobre las dinámicas de Ticketmaster al momento de vender boletos para shows masivos (REUTERS/AP)Mientras tanto, los fans especulan sobre la formación que acompañará a los Gallagher en esta gira. Se rumorea que el guitarrista original Paul ‘Bonehead’ Arthurs se unirá a la banda, junto con otros posibles miembros como el guitarrista Gem Archer y el bajista Andy Bell. Sin embargo, el baterista Alan White no formará parte del grupo, según NME. Liam Gallagher ha insinuado que la alineación podría incluir “algunas caras nuevas”.Además de la alineación, los seguidores de Oasis también debaten sobre los posibles actos de apertura. Radio X tells the full story of the bad blood between the brothers Gallagher... Fifteen years on from the acrimonious split of Oasis the great reconciliation between Liam and Noel is on. On the 27th August 2024, at 8am in the morning, it was announced that the Gallaghers would be performing together for the first time in 16 years in the summer of 2025, with multiple shows in Cardiff, Manchester, London, Edinburgh and Dublin. Many didn't think it would happen, such was the animosity between the two brothers. "I didn't leave Oasis," Liam Gallagher told Radio X at one point. "Noel Gallagher left Oasis. He couldn't handle the vibes any more. He couldn't handle the rock 'n' roll. He was too scared of it. So now he's gone all cosmic pop and Leo Sayer."But on the very first day of Radio X, 21st September 2015, Noel told Chris Moyles: "One should never say never, should one look like a bit of an idiot somewhere down the road, when you're waving a cheque for a quarter of a billion in The Sun!"So why did the band come to such a sorry end, and how did we get to where we are today? Radio X looks back at how the Oasis split happened. Liam Gallagher answers his Most Googled Questions The first public cracks in the Oasis facade came during a showcase gig at the Whiskey A Go Go in Los Angeles. According to the Supersonic film, the band were all in various states of "refreshment" and Liam started to fling insults at the band, chucking a tambourine at his brother. Dsgusted, Noel stormed off and disappeared for a couple of days. He eventually returned, but turned the incident into the brilliant song 'Talk Tonight'. Oasis - Bring It On Down (The Whiskey, LA, USA, 29-09-1994) An interview by journalist John Harris with Liam and Noel found its way onto vinyl and CD via the label Fierce Panda. The release, entitled Wibling Rivalry, was "14 minutes of verbal mayhem" according to the blurb and had been recorded the previous year and cemented the brothers' turbulent reputation in the minds of the public. Oasis - Wibling Rivalry (with transcript 1/2) During the recording of the second Oasis album (What's The Story) Morning Glory in Wales, Liam brought a group of people back to the studio while Noel was trying to work. Noel responded to this disruption by reportedly hitting his brother over the head with a handy cricket bat. The bat was rescued from the studio by writer Paolo Hewitt and later sold at auction. Noel Gallagher - According To Google Oasis were due to perform their high-profile MTV Unplugged show at the Royal Festival Hall in London straight after their huge Knebworth gigs, but Liam pulled out due to illness. Noel announced: "Liam ain't gonna be with us 'cause he's got a sore throat, so you're stuck with the ugly f---" went on to play a 12-song set, proving he didn't need his brother. Despite not wanting to join them on stage, Liam decided to watch the whole show and heckle from the crowd. Bad vibes. Oasis - Live Forever (Acoustic) MTV 1994 (HD) At the very last minute, Liam pulled out of a US tour, leaving Noel to front the band. A statement from Creation Records said: "Liam was called away at the last minute to sort out a personal matter" Turns out, Liam had sold his house but had nowhere for his wife to live. He joined the tour three days later, but the tour was cancelled after two weeks. Oasis "Liam pulls out of US tour" report | Newsround (CBBC) | August 1996 A show in Spain was cancelled after drummer Alan White injured his arm, leaving the rest of the band to start drinking. As the night wore on, an argument ensued, in which Liam apparently questioned the legitimacy of Noel's daughter Anais. Noel attacks Liam and leaves the band for the second time and the band completed the rest of the European tour without him.The band's Heathen Chemistry tour was marred by problems with Liam's voice - a show in Spain in July was postponed and a show in Florida the following month saw the singer leave the stage after four songs. At a show in Fukuoka Kokusai Centre in Japan on 1 October, Liam lasted just six songs. The year ended with Liam involved in a brawl in a Munchb bar, kicking a German police officer and losing several teeth in the fracas. The remaining Oasis dates in Germany were cancelled while the younger Gallagher visited the dentist.At the Heineken Jammin' Festival in Imola, Italy, Liam led the stage during Champagne Supernova. In an interview with Spin magazine in October that year, Noel said of his brother: "I've kind of learnt that instead of arguing stuff out with him and ending up in a fight, I work on his psychology and he's completely freaked out by me now. He's actually frightened to death of me."In an interview with Q magazine, Noel made his notorious comment about Liam: He's the angriest man you'll ever meet. He's like a man with a fork in a world of soup." In the summer there was much bickering between the brothers on social media, with Noel claiming "Life would be easier without Oasis..." Noel claimed his brother was "hungover", which later led Liam to take legal action - Noel would apologise and the legal action was dropped. Liam Gallagher on THAT Pretty Green spat with Noel As Oasis prepared to go onstage at the Rock En Seine festival in Paris, an argument broke out, with Liam wielding Noel's guitar around "like an axe". It was the last straw: the show was cancelled, along with the rest of the tour and Noel issued a statement: "It's with some sadness and great relief to tell you that I quit Oasis tonight. People will write and say what they like, but I simply could not go on working with Liam a day longer." In another statement a few days later, titled "Tales From The Middle Of Nowhere", Noel added: "The details are not important and of too great a number to list. But I feel you have the right to know that the level of verbal and violent intimidation towards me, my family, friends and comrades has become intolerable. And the lack of support and understanding from my management and band mates has left me with no other option than to get me cape and seek pastures new."Noel later claimed that the argument was started over an ad for Liam's clothing firm Pretty Green in the V Festival programme... However, Noel later told Radio X: "I had enough when Liam and Bonehead - and this is true - started arguing over a leather jacket. I am not even kidding, I can dress it up more than this, but this is what happened." What Would An Oasis Reunion Mean To Liam Gallagher? In the aftermath of the split, Liam announced that he was to start a new band with former Oasis members Gem Archer, Andy Bell and Chris Sharrock. The band was to be called Beady Eye and would ultimately release two albums: Different Gear Still Speeding (2011) and BE (2013). Beady Eye - Flick of the Finger Noel Gallagher officially launched his career as a solo artist with a show for Teenage Cancer Trust at the Royal Albert Hall in London. He avoided playing any new songs, saying: "As f**king brilliant as they are, now's not the right time or right place." Noel Gallagher - Whatever Teenage Cancer Trust 2010 At the closing ceremony for the London Olympics, Liam appeared with Beady Eye to sing the Oasis hit Wonderful. Speaking to Radio X shortly afterwards, Noel claimed that the organisers had to get his agreement for the iconic track to be used by his brother/former bandmate's new band. "I did play a bit of cat and mouse with them for a few days - I took it 'til Friday night at ten o'clock before I said yes and they were shitting it." Speaking to Rolling Stone magazine, Noel said of a potential Oasis reunion: "We are split up. You've heard that, haven't you? You must've heard... Yeah, so, ergo, band splits up, band is no more. There is no band. So, no, I won't be getting involved, anyway. If there is a reunion, I won't be in it."Liam tweets that his solo band Beady Eye have called it a day. The announcement immediately started Oasis reunion rumours, with some people even going as far as to speculate that they'd play Glastonbury in 2015. Noel told Radio X: "I'm available that weekend - it's not up to me though, is it?" Beady Eye are now on longer. Thanks for all your support. This was a "dry" gig, meaning Liam let rip, while also offering a plea to his brother to get Oasis back together: "I forgive you now let's get the BIG O back together and stop f**king about the drinks are on me LG x" When Noel didn't respond, Liam tweeted "I'll take that as a no then."
