When I need actors for Reader's Theater, I ask for volunteers. (The document pictured has the answers highlighted.) Tell the class that the two students in the front are Miguel and that you are going to interview him. I can't believe this is based on a true story with all the unbelievable stuff in it. In each square of the paper, write one of the following names: Miguel, Yordani, Fabio, and Gloria. After watching the video for chapter 1, continue to the video for chapter 2. Plus, it seems a bit strange for Miguel to be in a life-threatening situation where they have literally lost members of their group to the sea, and yet he's just concerned with Gloria giving him attention. I would recommend this for a beginner at Spanish but definitely not for fluent Spanish speakers. When you find someone that hams it up when acting, your job providing compelling, comprehensible input becomes easy in a snap. Ask students to brainstorm why a person would not go to a concert and then list the possibilities on the board, each time repeating "(name) se queda en casa porque..." And I like how they even added the Cuban culture reference in there too. December 3, 2016At a mere 35 pages, this newest Story from Mira Canion arrives right on time with the death of Fidel Castro. Then I handed them the paper on the right and they chose one of the answers on the board, or one they had on their paper, and copied it into the bubbles on the paper. Students listen to the two answers and write the letter (a or b) of the correct answer. As you read, the students will write information they learn about the characters. If you enjoy reading as a way of learning Spanish, I'll have other books available to you to borrow. I finished reading it in couple hours. Sometimes the class "voluntold" their friends, but I always check to make sure the students is ok with being an actor. (See this post for information on preparing to read a novel and specific ideas for El Escape Cubano.) Below are a few of the activities I used when reading the novel with my Spanish 2 students. Our story continues where it left off last time. May 15, 2019I thought this book was a very interesting book. In this video, Miguel will go to his friend Fabio's house because he has an idea. I used some facts that Mira had sent me when I was piloting the book. If you haven't told the students any statistics about the number of people that die each year attempting to reach the US in a raft, this would be a great time to introduce that material. Very easy to read and filled with useful vocabulary. All shadow libraries that we have indexed on here primarily use MD5s to identify files. Miguel went home with his father after meeting with his friend Fabio. The teacher reads chapters 1 and 2 to the students. I will be adding a few copies of this to my classroom library as it is a great book for independent reading with Spanish learner at the high school level.
