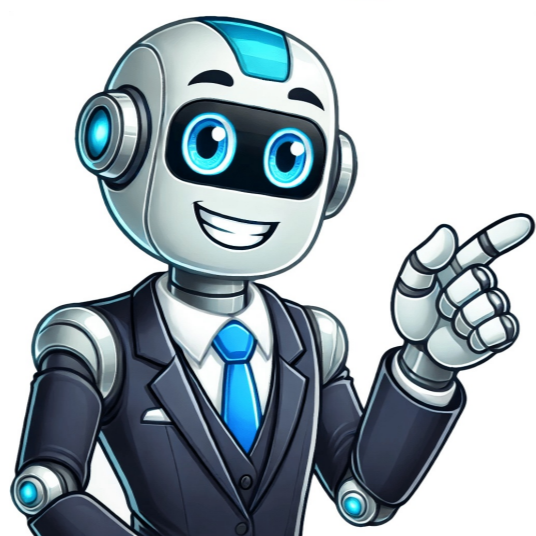

APA style consists of two parts: a brief in-text citation (that includes the authors' surnames and publication year) which directs readers to a comprehensive reference list entry at the end of your work. This guide adheres to the 7th edition of the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (2020), offering guidance to help you: create accurate citations and references for your academic work format your in-text citations and reference list correctly check your work against verified examples understand APA's author-date citation system. APA7 style requires that in-text citations consist of the author(s) and date, in brackets, with a comma in between, eg: (Smith, 2020). Example: Empirical research focused on guided imagery interventions supports the efficacy of the technique with a variety of populations within hospital settings, with positive outcomes for individuals diagnosed with depression, anxiety, and eating disorders (Itay & Miller, 2006). Author Use the surname/family name of the author(s). The table below includes examples on how to format in-text references for one, two, three or more authors. More examples can be found in the APA7 Examplestab. Single author Two authors Three or more authors Author's surname Both author's surnames, in the same order as on the publication, separated by an ampersand (&') If using the author's name in your sentence (a "narrative reference") spell out the 'and' List the first author's surname only, followed by "et al." Example: (Nguyen, 2020) Examples: (Xi & Carson, 2019) Salas and D'Agostino (2020) found that ... Example: (Martin et al., 2020) Organisational or group author - if a company, organisation or group is the author, and no individual people are named, use the name of the organisation as the author. Write the name out in full the first time it appears, and include the abbreviation in square brackets. In any later references to the same organisation, use the abbreviation. Example: (National Institute of Mental Health [NIMH], 2020) in the first reference, then (NIMH, 2020) in subsequent references. For Government agencies - the most specific level appears in the in-text reference, (full details in the references list). For example, use 'National Institute of Nursing Research' as the author in-text rather than 'Department of Health and Human Services' No author - Use a few words of the title in double quotation marks, and provide the date ("Title is", Year). See APA missing information for examples. If citing an author that is quoted or referred to in another publication see our advice for citing this as a secondary source. Date Use the year your reference was published, for example (Author, 2021) If no date, use "n.d.", for example, (Author, n.d.) For items that have been accepted for publication but not yet published, use "in press". Multiple references in the same location If citing multiple items in the same point in your document, place in alphabetical order by first author's surname with a semicolon between them. For example, (Barker & Atif, 2019; Lai, 2019). Use of page numbers in-text Quotations Include a page number/s in your in-text reference where you are directly quoting. However it is best to paraphrase. Only quote if the original author's exact wording is definitely required. See this "Quotations" section of the APA Blog for guidance on when to use direct quotes and how to construct in-text references from materials with and without page numbers. Example: Guided imagery and relaxation techniques have even been found to reduce distress and allow the immune system to function more effectively (Trakhtenberg, 2008, p. 850). Paraphrasing Paraphrase by summarising, rephrasing and restating in your own words, an idea taken from a source. Although not required, it would be beneficial to include page numbers to facilitate locating specific passages connected to the paraphrased idea within a lengthy work, such as in a book. Page 2 EndNote is a program/application which helps you with referencing. It enables you to create a library of references/sources you are using in your learning or research. EndNote can be used with Word to help create your in-text citations and end reference list. The University Library EndNote guide includes information on downloading references from UWA databases, reference styles and links to valuable information sources. The EndNote style which best supports the APA 7th edition is titled APA 7th - American Psychological Association 7th Edition This style comes as part of EndNote 20, if using EndNote X9 or earlier you will need to download the style. Download the style from the EndNote Output Styles page (please ensure that you choose the style entitled APA 7th) Ensure you follow the 'installing a style' instructions in the EndNote guide. When using EndNote you will still need to have an understanding of the essential elements to be included in an APA reference as well, as its format, especially if you have to manually enter references into your EndNote library. Note that EndNote does not support the rule for 20 or more authors, where the rule is to list the first 19, followed by You will need to manually edit your reference for it to display correctly. This is easiest done by converting your document to plain text and manually correcting it. Clarification for using the Web Page reference type, retrieval dates, contributor roles, records from Web of Science, computer software, mobile apps, apparatus and equipment, as well as audio, are explained on when to use direct reference types in your document alongside the EndNote insertions following the formatting layout in our APA 7th guide or the APA Style Blog. Note: be extremely careful as to not accidentally delete any citations inserted by the EndNote. If you are an advanced EndNote user you can follow these steps to modify the style: 1. Open EndNote program. 2. Go to Tools > Output Styles > Open style manager. 3. Select APA 7th and click Edit. 4. Go to Bibliography > Templates and look for Computer Programs. 5. Delete the full stop after the Title statement from the template. 6. Delete the In from in front of the Series - Title statement in the template. 7. Go to File > Save as and insert a new name such as APA 7th Copy or APA 7th Edited so you can identify your modified style. 8. In Word and EndNote select the new edited style.
