If you haven't played a Monster Hunter game in a while or Rise is your first one then there are several things to keep in mind in order for you to be an efficient hunter.We'll go over the best tips for improving your combat, keeping your weapons as powerful as possible, and adjusting menus so you can use your best items quickly.PSA: There's a bug where if you're set to offline on your Xbox friends list, Monster Hunter Rise can't see you so you can't connect properly. Choose the best weapon for you(Image credit: Windows Central)Monster Hunter Rise's 14 weapons types each have unique rules and button combos, which means they each take time to really master. You should spend time in Kamura Village's Training Room to get a feel for each of the weapons before going on hunts in earnest. You can access the Training Room by going to the Buddy Plaza and interacting with the small ship between the wolf statues.Easiest weapons for beginners: I recommend starting with either the Dual Blades or the Sword and Shield. The Dual Blades are nice because they fit fast and allow you to move around monsters quickly. However, they are low-damage weapons. The Sword and Shield is also easier to master since they are simpler and don't have any complex demon gauges to deal with like other weapons do. It's also possible to use potions and items without sheathing, which is very helpful.Of course, if you feel a natural proclivity for a specific weapon lean into it. The vast options available to players is one of the things that makes this one of the best Xbox games out there.2. Keep your weapons sharp(Image credit: Windows Central)If you're using a melee weapon, you'll see a sharpness level gauge under the green and yellow (health and stamina) bars at the top of the screen. Your weapon gets dull after being used and won't damage as much. Because of this, you need to constantly check this sharpness level gauge and take time to use a whetstone to sharpen it back up so you can deal more damage.All the latest news, reviews, and guides for Windows and Xbox deahads.Swipe to see horizontallySharpness level:Red:0.5,Orange:1,Green:1.5,Blue:2,White:3.2,Purple:1.39,As you upgrade your weapons, you'll see a sharpness level gauge that they can be even sharper and thus deal more damage to your weapons you start using.As you can see from the chart, red is very dull and cuts your damage by half while a weapon's sharpness level in the green, blue, white, and purple ranges allows you to inflict the best damage.(Image credit: Capcom)Since there are many items in Monster Hunter Rise, going through the inventory menus during battle can be a time-consuming and annoying. That's why you should take advantage of customizing your radial menu. To do this, open Items and Equipment then select Radial Menu Settings and make your changes.This wheel opens quickly and you can assign your most-used crafting shortcuts, partner commands, or items to it. So if your weapon requires you to craft ranged ammo then you'll want to assign ammo crafting to your wheel to save you time. If you have a melee weapon, I highly recommend putting your whetstone in one of these directions for quick access.This ease of customization extends to Monster Hunter Rise's other menus and HUD as well. Take time to experiment with your control scheme and other options until you find a setup you like best.4. Practice with the wirebug(Image credit: Capcom)The wirebug is a brand new tool to the Monster Hunter series that was introduced with Rise. It allows players to reach distant heights and perform better in combat. While on a map, take some time to experiment and get your fingers used to performing actions like fast traversal for exploring, collecting items in high-up places, and inflicting silkbind attacks on monsters.By the way, performing silkbind attacks a couple of times on lower-level monsters can even let you ride and fight with them in what is known as Wyvern Riding.Once the wirebug is mastered you'll find yourself getting through areas more efficiently, avoiding taking damage more often, and defeating monsters faster.5. Grab all items and upgrade!(Image credit: Windows Central)No matter how small or insignificant an item might appear to be, you'll want to collect everything you possibly can while on a mission. That's because any loot you pull from monsters or off the ground might just help you buy or upgrade better armor and weapons, which will make you more powerful.In fact, you should make it a habit of running to the Kamura Village Smithy between each mission just to see if you can get anything that's better than what you currently have. If you have an eye on a specific item to upgrade work towards fighting the appropriate monsters and acquiring the items you need.Note: you can loot from a monster (Monster) up to the end of the original Hub Quest line will reach this point automatically upon downloading Update 2.0. How to Beat Thunder Serpent Narwa During HR 1-7, your Hunter Rank is limited by your current ranking and Urgent Quests are required to advance. Breaking each new Hunter Rank Cap unlocks new Quests and features, so keep moving on up! To unlock the Hunts for the Apex Monsters, the player must defeat that Apex Monster in a Rampage Quest first. Hub Quest Guide and List of Hub Quests As of Update 3.0, the best way to farm HR points from HR8 to HR100 is doing Rampage Quests specifically those that feature Apex Monsters. Based on our testing, these give off the greatest HR Points - much more so if your performance merit an S Rank! Rampage Quests takes a long time but is generally not difficult because the Hunting Installations and Warriors of Kamura are there to help you! Rampage Guide: How to Get S-Rank The Narwa quest Serpent Goddess of Thunder is still a reliable way to farm Materials for Talisman Melding and farm HR points. It is fast and easy especially if you have mastered all of Narwa's phases and moves. However, the HR points given by this quest falls off when in higher HR, especially if you are farming for that coveted HR100 Urgent Quest against Crimson Glow Valstrax. This quest is ideal if you also want to get a ton of melding materials from each hunt. But if you are looking to speed through the ranks, we highly suggest you farm the Apex Rampage quests! We've provided a few examples of the number of Hunter Rank Points gained from each Quest for your convenience. While Narwa doesn't yield the most HR Points, it's a simple and reliable method to increase steadily up through HR 20. After that, your HR point requirement per HR will increase and you will feel the Narwa quest lacking. HR Points from Rampage Quests also vary depending on the final monster (Apex or Normal Monster) and the completion ranking (A or S). Rampage Quests take time but are generally easier because of the Hunting Installations so we suggest running them at higher HR! There are a lot of opportunities to climb the ranks when you participate in online Join Requests. Sometimes, you may join 5 minutes into the middle of a hunt, making the session supposedly shorter than going solo. These can help if you want to hunt with others or are trying to fight monsters you are having a hard time clearing. However, the amount of Join Requests available will vary depending on how many people are actively using them. So they may not be one of the best ways to farm for Hunter Ranks. They are still effective if there are a lot of people playing online! Try taking Join Requests on Thunder Serpent Narwa or Crimson Glow Valstrax, as each give a ton of HR points. Take note that Join Requests are not available for Village Quests. Co-op Multiplayer Guide As you continue taking quests in the Sunbreak expansion, your Hunter Rank will naturally increase. Master Rank quests require the Sunbreak expansion, and can be started by taking the hunting request for Daimyo Hermitaur from Rondine the Trader after defeating Thunder Serpent Narwa. Be sure to take them since they give a chunk of HR points, too! Every quest will always provide Hunter Rank points in Master Rank, so you do not have to worry about taking Low Rank or High Requests again to increase your rank if you decide to continue the story in Elgado. By this time, you will want to prioritize increasing your Master Rank to unlock more quests and clear caps just like those seen prior to HR100. How to Unlock Master Rank The Hunter Rank (HR) is an indicator of the player's overall progress and is often a sign on how experience a player has. You climb the ranks by participating and clearing quests. Higher-ranked quests give out more points, and higher ranks give you access to more quests. By default, there is no rank limit to who can join your session in multiplayer. You can set the rank limits, however, when setting up a lobby. Participating in Join Requests has no rank limitations, so theoretically an HR999 can join you when you have a join request set to on. Your Hunter Rank can be seen by going to your Items and Equipment Menu and selecting Status. On the very first page, you can find your Hunter Rank. Looking at your Guild Card also shows you what your Hunter
Rank is currently at! Many hard quests in the later parts of the game require a certain HR to unlock. For example, Crimson Glow Valstrax's quest is an HR100 Urgent quest so you need to be at least HR100 to take it on! How to Unlock High Rank It is confirmed that the maximum Hunter Rank for Monster Hunter Rise (MHRise) is HR999! After breaking the HR Cap at 100 by completing the Crimson Glow Valstrax Urgent Hub Quest, players have no more limits on their HR and can go as high as 999 by continuing to grind Quests and earn more HR Points. For players who have not yet broken the HR 7 cap, the only way to increase your Hunter Rank (HR) is to clear specific Hub Quests. Completing Key Hub Quests will unlock an Urgent Hub Quest that upon completion will unlock the next level of Hub Quests and subsequently increase your Hunter Rank. In Update 2.0, upon reaching HR 8 after defeating Thunder Serpent Narwa in the quest Serpent Goddess of Thunder, Hunter Rank is capped at specific levels and the Hunter Rank Point system is implemented, allowing you to increase your Hunter Rank from completing any Quest. Your Hunter Rank in Monster Hunter Rise represents your progression within Gathering Hub Key Quests and is capped until certain conditions are met.In Monster Hunter Rise, your Hunter Rank is directly tied with your Gathering Hub Quest progression. So, if you have unlocked 5-Star Quests, your HR will be HR5 - at least until you uncapp your HR (see below.) Unlike previous Monster Hunter games, in Rise, you can join any Low-Rank Hunter (1 to 3-Star in the Gathering Hub) from the start, and most High Rank Quests 4-Star to 7-Star once you're HR4. Someone else just needs to post the quest for you. All quests will be considered complete once unlocked, except Urgent Quests. These will only count as completed if you have them unlocked when you do themOnce Hunter Rank is "uncapped" - you can continue raising Hunter Rank by completing quests, which grant a certain amount of points depending on the quest type. The Hunter Rank was previously capped at HR7 before the first title update. With the April Update - Patch Version 2.0 that was made available on April 28th, your Hunter Rank is now unlocked. You can unlock your Hunter Rank cap by completing the 7-Star Gathering Hub Urgent Quest that asks you to slay the Thunder Serpent Narwa. After this reach all the quests that contribute to increasing your Hunter Rank when you first complete this quest, your Hunter Rank will be capped at 20. This also includes the ability to craft decorations. Unlocking High Rank is rather straightforward, as its something you get to as you progress through the game, but its worth noting that High Rank only exists in Hub Quests, not Village Quests. Alternatively, you can unlock High Rank by finishing Special License Tests in the Village. Special License Tests are quests that allow you to skip the lower quests in Hub if you only or mostly progress through Village Quests. The purpose of this is so that players don't have to repeat similar or the same quests in lower Hub that they did in Village if they do not wish to. To unlock Special License Tests, you will need to reach a certain level in Village Quests while also having the Hub Quests below a certain level. Finishing each Special License Test will increase your Hub Quest rank by 1. Several weeks ago, Capcom released Monster Hunter Rise, the sixth mainline installment to the franchise after 2017's Monster Hunter World. Although Monster Hunter Rise is only available on the Nintendo Switch at the moment,Capcom confirmed that the gameworld eventually make its wayto PC. Now that Monster Hunter Rise is released and is quickly shaping up to be a great game, some players on PlayStation and Xbox consoles are now wondering whether the game will also be ported on these systems. Although Capcom hasn't shot down the release of Monster Hunter Rise on PlayStation and Xbox consoles, the prospect remains unlikely, especially now that the PC port has been
confirmed. Monster Hunter Rise Was Made For The Switch Given that both Sony and Microsoft just releasednew consoles, someplayers wonder why Capcom chose not to release Monster Hunter Rise onthe PS5 and Xbox Series Xor their last-gen counterparts.According to Capcom,Monster Hunter Rise was explicitly made for the Nintendo Switch in mind, its hybrid functionality that combines a home console and a handheld device. When the studio released Monster Hunter World in 2017, the Switch just came out, and Capcom saw its potential in offering players the flexibility to let players play on their TV or on the go. This observation became the primary motivation for Capcom to develop another Monster Hunter game that would utilize the Switch's core strength. In an interview, Capcom said that "we think by releasing this on a portable console we've made it a lot more accessible, a lot more easy to pick up and play." Additionally, Capcom revealed that Monster Hunter Rise is bestplayed on the Switch, given that players can pick it up, do a couple of quests, and do other things. It is also worth remembering that while 2017's Monster Hunter World became a massive hit, its absence on the Switch isolated Nintendo players. Although Capcom never mentioned this specifically, it is possible that the studio decided to release Monster Hunter Rise on the Switch to compensate for the absence of Monster Hunter World on the hybrid platform. Additionally, unlike Monster Hunter Rise, which was made for the Switch, Monster Hunter World used more powerful features that may be too much for the Switch to handle. In previous Monster Hunter games, players are limited to small, numbers areas separated by loading screens. However, Monster Hunter World features complex multilevel stages that include open-world environments best played on the PS4, Xbox One, and PC. All in all,Monster Hunter World is best suited for players looking for an epic adventure complete with more monsters, bigger environments, and complex graphics. On the other hand, Monster Hunter Rise is targeted at players who are on the go and are looking for a great Monster Hunter game that they can easily pick up and play during a commute, break times, or before going to sleep. Furthermore, High-Rank hunts appear to be tied completely to the Hub, there are no single-player High Rank hunts available in Monster Hunter Rise as of writing. These are reserved for completing exceptionally challenging hunts and the more demanding Rampage missions. If the mission rewards Commendations, start grinding. Case in point, you'll be getting very familiar with this nightmare of the good stuff.If you do need some help with farming, I have two crucial tips. The first is try to get gathering focused buffs from eating Bunny Dango before every hunt. Getting something as simple as twice as much ore on gathering spots will help a bunch. The second is recruit a Palico on the hunt marked as a Gatherer, and level them up. This will make them gain perks like picking up items you've missed, and even being able to carve monsters during hunts to get some extra stuff. Rampage Guide: How to Get S-Rank The Narwa quest Serpent Goddess of Thunder is still a reliable way to farm Materials for Talisman Melding and farm HR points. It is fast and easy especially if you have mastered all of Narwa's phases and moves. However, the HR points given by this quest falls off when in higher HR, especially if you are farming for that coveted HR100 Urgent Quest against Crimson Glow Valstrax. This quest is ideal if you also want to get a ton of melding materials from each hunt. But if you are looking to speed through the ranks, we highly suggest you farm the Apex Rampage quests! We've provided a few examples of the number of Hunter Rank Points gained from each Quest for your convenience. Be sure to take them since they give a chunk of HR points, too!
